





- X is perhaps the most influential martial artist of all time. In addition to being a martial artist and teacher, he was an actor, philosopher, film director, producer, and screen writer.
- X's lasting contribution is the art of Jeet Kune Do, which he created by combining different fighting styles. X has been the star and subject of numerous films.
- Y's worldwide fame increased considerably after a 2008 film loosely based on his life, in which he was played by Donnie Yen.
- Y's legacy is the global practice of Wing Chun Kung Fu, although he is perhaps most well-known today for being X's martial arts teacher.

- X has been controversially nominated for the Nobel Prize in Literature since 1997.




- After a misunderstanding during World War 2, Rudolf left GDS to found his own company, which is also based in Herzogenaurach. Name this company.







Sibir newspaper, July 2, 1908

On the 17th of June, around 9 a.m. in the morning, we observed an unusual natural occurrence. In the north Kareliniski village the peasants saw to the north west, rather high above the horizon, some strangely bright (impossible to look at) bluish-white heavenly body, which for 10 minutes moved downwards. The body appeared as a "pipe. As the body neared the ground (forest), the bright body seemed to smudge, and then turned into a giant billow of black smoke, and a loud knocking (not thunder) was heard, as if large stones were falling, or artillery was fired. All buildings shook. At the same time the cloud began emitting flames of uncertain shapes.

The Haka



- Kuru is an incurable nervous disorder caused by a prion found in humans, which was first discovered among the tribes of Papua New Guinea.

- What was this unique dietary preference?


Cannibalism
